Presidential Report - October 2019

Last month's meeting at Calhoun's on the river was another successful

meeting of networking and an informative presentation by James Cain, the Executive director for Southeast Concrete Masonry Association (SCMA). James spoke about relevant code updates, benefits of thermal mass, and safety advantages of concrete masonry. I think if there was one thing he wanted you to get out of his presentation is that no matter all the pros and cons of building materials of walls, concrete masonry is one of the safest options for wind, fire, and moisture resistance. It isn't necessary (or cost effective) for everything we design and construct to be built with completely noncombustible materials, but by using concrete masonry, especially in residential projects, we can increase the wind and fire resistance and decrease the chances of lives lost and property damage.

This month's meeting at Calhoun's on the river we will have a presentation on the "Design of Seating Spaces for Auditoriums & Theaters" which qualifies for an HSW credit. This presentation will cover basic terms for auditorium seating, typical seating configurations, safety and codes. I hope you can make it and please introduce yourself if we haven't met yet. I would love to talk and learn why you joined CSI! Remember that that you can bring a guest and their first meeting is free!


