



AUGUST 2022 PRESENTATION

WE DIDN'T START THE FIRE

A description of the course is as follows:

Description: An introduction to the circumstances behind notable fires and other disasters that created and/or changed the building construction codes through history. This will aide building design and construction personnel in understanding some of the past and current building codes.

Learning Objective:

1. The discussion starts with a description of the Million Dollar Fire in Knoxville and several key elements that were missing in a downtown hotel and how fire-fighting aid from Chattanooga helped control the fire to two city blocks.

2. Several additional notable fires starting with the Great Chicago fire and building code changes that resulted.

3. The recent Grenfell Tower causes and flame spread are discussed and building material changes are discussed.

4. Several building system collapses are described and building construction practices that changed as a result.

The participants will be able to discuss the key elements which stopped the Knoxville fire, building code revisions from other notable fires, and the changes in building processes that prevent the collapses.

Presentation: The CES facilitator utilizes a PowerPoint presentation to provide viewers with excellent visual representations (pictures, charts, diagrams, etc.) and detailed commentary of the . The facilitator will also allow time for questions to be answered during the presentation.

A/V Needed: A screen and electrical power. The facilitator provides the computer with the PowerPoint presentation and a digital projector.

Target Audiences: This presentation was developed for young architects, but is a good refresher course for seasoned building design and construction personnel. Facilitator Qualifications: The CES facilitator has over 35 years experience in mechanical consulting engineering work and has designed systems in approximately 40 states. He was recently elected to the CSI College of Fellows in 2022.

WHAT I LEARNED FROM CSI...

2022 CSI GULF STATES REGION CONFERENCE IN NASHVILLE, TN

It was a great 2022 CSI Gulf States Region Conference in Nashville, TN. There was a welcome reception, a retirement



send off for Dwight LeClair at Sherwin Williams, complete with a walking cane, and several fun fellowship evenings in the hospitality suite.

There were also several great seminars that offered CEU credit. The green roof of the "Nashville Music City Convention Center Lessons Learned" 10 years later seminar by John Robinson from Sika Sarnafil roofing was very interesting. The four-acre green roof with a white PVC waterproofing membrane underlayment mimics the rolling hills of Tennessee and includes 14 types of sedum and various wildflowers. The roof paver pattern which allows green roof maintenance mimics the frets on a guitar neck. The green roof is an additional layer of insulation which results from the 1600 cubic yards of engineered soil and plants that reduces the heating and cooling costs. The composition and mass of the green roof combined with the highly reflective exposed PVC roof system reduces the heat island effect. Contrary to popular opinion, the weight of the green roof reduces the structural system because the weight of the green roof reduces the structure needed to prevent wind uplift. The green roof includes a drip irrigation system supplied by the rainwater collection system that is stored in an underground 360,000-gallon cistern. The rainwater is also used in the building's public toilets and urinals. A hose bibb is required to provide water to the developing plants before the irrigation system is completed.

The system also includes four beehives and produces 100# of honey each year. The beehives are managed by the local beekeeper society. The honey is sold in the convention center gift shop. We learned that just like your home lawn, a green roof can require some maintenance and can also turn brown if not actively managed. The roof system has a leak detection system consisting of a wire grid that can pinpoint the location of the roof leaks, so it is not necessary to remove much of the green roof to make repairs.

CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS INSTITUTE

As part of an urban landscape, the roof collects several buckets of spent firearm projectiles over one year. As John said, "What goes up, must come down" and often lands on such a large roof area and causes roof leaks.
