

ABOUT THIS COURSE

Knoxville Utilities Board will present an interactive, educational course providing insights into the intricate workings of essential infrastructure within their jurisdiction. Through a combination of instruction and hands-on demonstrations, participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of the operations and safety protocols surrounding overhead power lines, as demonstrated by skilled line workers who showcase the equipment and techniques utilized in maintenance and repair tasks. Additionally, the underground water and gas line team will explain the complexities of their trade, showcasing specialized tools and procedures for installing and maintaining these critical systems. By

offering a firsthand look into the daily tasks and safety measures practiced by utility workers, this course equips attendees with the knowledge and appreciation necessary for the efficient and safe functioning of vital community infrastructure.

HSW JUSTIFICATION

The course will provide firsthand insight into the practical aspects of utility infrastructure systems and procedures. Understanding the intricacies of utility infrastructure ensures that architectural designs and construction plans are compatible with existing utilities, reducing the risk of accidents, interruptions, and costly delays. Moreover, learning directly from field workers promotes a deeper appreciation for safety protocols and maintenance requirements, ultimately enhancing the health, safety, and welfare of the community by fostering collaboration and informed decision-making among stakeholders.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Upon completion of this course, participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of utility infrastructure: Attendees will gain knowledge about the various types of utility systems, including electricity, water, gas, and telecommunications, along with their components, functions, and interdependencies.
2. Safety protocols and best practices: Participants will learn essential safety measures and procedures practiced by field workers, including proper equipment usage, hazard identification, and emergency response protocols, enhancing their ability to mitigate risks and ensure the safety of construction projects.
3. Once upon a time, in a galaxy far away – oh, no – Tennessee is not that far away! Would Wisconsin qualify as being far away? How about Wisconsin to Tennessee? Far enough apart? Our story begins in both states; in Wisconsin where Lynn Javoroski FCSI lives, and in Tennessee, where her niece Karina Kane, lives. About 4 years ago, Lynn found out that Karina was going to enroll at the University of Tennessee College of Architecture and Design (CoAD).


Lynn had a lot of architecture books looking for a new home, so the families met in Columbus, Indiana, toured around, and the books were passed along. Fast forward to this fall, when one of the recipients of a CSI scholarship was a graduate of UTK (CoAD). Lynn asked Karina if she knew the scholarship winner. Karina did not, but asked about the scholarship opportunity. So Lynn contacted Brent Williams to ask about Architecture Career Day at the college, hoping that Karina could learn more about CSI. Brent reached out to Gary Bergeron FCSI, (the Yoda of the chapter according to Brent), And that brings us to today and the story as written by Gary. CSI friends, I'd like to introduce you to Karina Kane, a third year architecture student at the University of Tennessee College of Architecture and Design. It all started with a text message from our chapter president who asked if I knew of an opportunity for a student to do some job shadowing in the local AECO industry. Karina was originally supposed to shadow at a local combined A/E firm but the schedules didn't work out. Luckily for our firm, Kelso-Regen Consulting Engineers, she called and asked if there was an opportunity to shadow at our firm over her Christmas break. We started the morning with some samples of fire sprinkler heads that are used in several different types of buildings. Karina was shown a church floor plan that our office was currently designing and we showed how the different sprinkler heads for light hazard occupancy are located in both acoustical tile ceilings (white semi-recessed pendant sprinkler heads) and exposed structure (upright brass sprinkler heads).

She was a quick study and offered to finish the sprinkler design intent drawing, showing the sprinkler heads in the church. After a review of her work, we corrected a few minor discrepancies. Karina attended a progress meeting on the church with the Architect, Owner, Electrical Engineer, Civil Engineer, and myself on the following day. It was at the progress meeting that Karina observed the architect is like the conductor of the orchestra of engineers, contractors, and owner. After the progress meeting, we visited three architectural firms and one electrical engineering firm which have several female team members. Karina was able to observe the offices in action and obtained several business cards for future contacts. Later in the day, we had a site visit with another architect, contractor, and engineers to evaluate the existing conditions of a building, a halfway house being renovated and doubled in size.

Karina returned to our office this past week to work on several other projects including a wedding event center with a guest lodge, a veterinary clinic, a car dealership, and a warehouse. Karina went on a site visit to a major expansion and renovation of a Kroger grocery store in Marietta, GA. In addition to the routine Kroger equipment, the store was expanding to an adjacent breezeway between it and adjacent retail shops. Because of a minor dimension error, the Kroger expansion was drawn infringing on the breezeway, specifically prohibited in the landlord/Kroger lease agreement. Karina asked the obvious question: would reducing the Kroger footprint by 1'-2" prevent the infringement as detailed in the lease agreement. After several discussions, the Kroger project manager agreed that was the simple solution.

Kelso-Regen is offering Karina a part time position while she completes her architecture degree. We hope that Karina will continue with her architectural studies with different valuable project exposures.


