THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

RAYMOND GUAY - MY FIRST TASTE OF SCOTCH

All of us have our career histories, some much longer than others, and with the associated stories behind that history: firms we worked with, architects who shaped our lives, jerks who disappointed us, close friends we made, our successes and failures. One previous article asked you about your stories related to CSI. Those of us who have a history with CSI for some length of time probably have many stories. Here is one who is memorable to me and I want to share it with you all.

After a short stint of practice on my own I took a position of responsibility with Guay & Associates Architects here in Knoxville in 1984. I had never heard of the firm before but was impressed with their longevity of almost 30 years and with its white haired principal, Ray Guay. Now that's a name that just rolls off your tongue, doesn't it?

I was first impressed with the library the firm had amassed, with shelves and shelves of resource and technical literature - NFPA, ASTM, UL, BOMA, manufacturers catalogues, architectural magazines, and on and on. If you needed something Ray probably had it. I later found the reason the firm maintained such a comprehensive library was because Ray Guay was a seasoned specifications writer and a collector. He was in fact one of a small group of founders of CSI Knoxville Chapter. I later found his name on some of the original documents of the chapter, including his tenure as its third president. It was at this time I also met Cas Sweetzer who was the firm's specification writer. Many of you probably remember Cas as an active member of our Chapter long after his retirement. Everybody loved Cas. Both Cas and Ray were old school, they did cut and paste specs from hard copy masters or previous project specs, a real task compared to the way most of us work today. Their masters were probably assembled on their own, not Masterspec or Speclink or whatever. Initially all typed on manual typewriters, the closest they got to technology was an IBM Selectric typewriter. These men were the first to encourage me to become involved with CSI.

Ray Guay came to Knoxville from Taunton, Massachusetts, southeast of Boston, from a French Canadian family lineage. His father was a lumberjack and contractor. Ray attended Catholic University in Washington, D.C. and received his masters degree at Columbia University. He worked in his father's construction business until WWII when he joined the Air Force and became an Air Force pilot instructor for the Free French Cadets in Mobile Alabama. It didn't hurt that Ray was of French Canadian descent and spoke french.

It was the Jefferson Junior High School in Oak Ridge that brought Ray to Tennessee, where he worked as construction superintendent in the 1950's. It was here he met Nancy who also worked in Oak Ridge and they married in 1955. He worked in Knoxville for architect David Liberman (some of you old guys may remember him) and established his own firm in Nashville in a convent working

for the Sisters of Mercy designing mostly hospitals, churches, and health care facilities.

Ray purchased the building at 16 Emory Place in 1962 with collateral from his old Volkswagen and converted the second floor into his architectural office.

Ray was father to 5 children, was an avid stamp and coin collector, and an establishing member of the Ancient Architects group which started in 2000. Ray was a member of the South Knoxville Rotary Club where he had the distinction of 50+ years of perfect attendance. Ray suffered a heart attack in 1991, but after a triple by-pass he continued until 2003 when he closed the firm of Guay & Associates.

Some of Ray's prized possessions were the handmade trim planes his father used, planers with had formed knives that would take a piece of raw wood and shape it to a complex trim form for door and window casing and for base or crown molding. All with much manual labor, no electric motors or power tools. Those were the days of real craftsmanship. Today we get most all trim from Home Depot or a lumber shop.

Some of my favorite memories of Ray was of his gruff voice and mannerisms, his humor, and the way he stirred his coffee. It was so funny when Ray got a cup of coffee; always sugar and creamer with a vigorous one minute stir that could be heard all over the office. He really could make a ceramic cup ring!

Ray and I did get to travel some together. I remember especially the time we shared a room (I don't know where), when after we got settled in, he pulls out a bottle of Scotch from his suitcase. That was my first taste of Scotch. So when I enjoy Scotch today I think of Ray and of Michelle, Fred, David, Robin, Ray the engineer, Cas, and others in that firm. My memories of Ray and of Guay & Associates are good ones to remember. I hope we are all building good memories and encouraging others in our field.

And for you, you may thank those early chapter founders like Euler, Guay, Sweetzer, and Rosenbaum for CSI in Knoxville. All are now gone, but it's good history and hopefully one we will continue to make better.
