

## WHAT I LEARNED FROM CSI... TOP 10 WOODWORK CONCERNS

I was very fortunate to hear Margaret Fisher of Architectural Woodwork Institute (AWI) speak at our regional conference in June. She shared with us the "Top 10 Woodwork Concerns." Margaret is a great speaker and shared things relative to both residential and commercial construction. She was great to answer questions, provide free access to the new Architectural Woodwork Standards (AWS) to those who attended, and provide other contacts and resources. Here are Margaret's top 10:

- 1. Relative Humidity Do you know the optimal relative humidity and moisture content for the wood on your project? Did you know that it depends upon the wood species? If wood is too dry, you will see cracks. If it is too humid, you will see swelling. Having the HVAC operational is not a proper spec.
- 2. Avoid "Natural" Disasters Often times, we think our specs call for one thing when the term actually means something completely different. When we specify "natural" wood, we are saying to include all types of wood present in that species. This means that the heart wood and sapwood may make your project look like a zebra!
- 3. Specify Veneer Cut Wood can be cut in several different ways. The way it is cut will drastically affect the price and the grain appearance. Some examples are plain sawn, quarter sawn, rotary cut, and rift cut. Each term means the wood comes off of the log in a different way.
- **4. Metamerism** Also called "barber-poling," metamerism is the light-dark-light-dark pattern that happens when you book match veneer. Try slip matched instead.
- **5. Submittals** There are standards for what shop drawings should show. Arm yourself with the ability to reject poor submittals.

- **6. Reviewing Submittals** Do you know what the AWS says your role in reviewing submittals is?
- 7. Sample Submittals Have you ever received one sample to represent a wood finish? How do you know what the acceptable range is in a natural product if you haven't been given control samples?
- **8.** Sample Quantity AWS requires a minimum of three samples.
- 9. Storage and Delivery Conditions Have you had completed woodwork delivered to a jobsite to find out later that it was damaged due to improper protection? Edge-banding glue reactivates at 100\*. Has your woodwork been stored in a controlled environment?
- 10. Cleaning Your woodwork should come with a warranty and cleaning instructions. Here's a hint: the cleaning product should not include wax or oil. Although I work with high quality wood finishes everyday, Margaret's talk reminded me there is a lot I don't know. The most important point she made, though, was that there is somewhere to turn to for that knowledge.

And isn't that exactly what CSI is all about?
